Theoretical & Quantum physics are interesting branches of science which differ from our commonly known classical physics. So let us know the essence of Quantum & Theoretical Physics :-

Theoretical Physics :-As the name suggests theoretical physics is a branch of physics which is based on developing and proving theories often relying on mathematical formalisms in order to explain what the universe really is and how it works.

Quantum Physics:- It is the branch of science which deals with the study of matter and energy at the most fundamental level. Its aim is to uncover the building blocks of the nature and universe. It helps us close the gaps in our knowledge of physics in order to give us a more complete picture of our everyday life and everything around us.

Some common topics regarding Theoretical and Quantum Physics are :-

The Big-Bang Theory : - This theory deals with the start of the universe itself. This theory explains that the universe expanded from an extremely small, extremely hot and dense state. It tells that the universe is constantly expanding and is being stretched at the

speed of light or even faster. The scary thing about this theory is that the universe could possibly stretch so much that we reach a void point where absolute nothing exists for trillions of kilometers or even more.

Einstein's Theory Of Relativity:- This famous theory created by one of the most famous scientist of the modern period Einstein tells us that space time are interconnected and relative. It also suggests that the laws of physics are same for everyone, no matter how fast they are moving or how fast their speed is and the speed of light is constant for all observers. 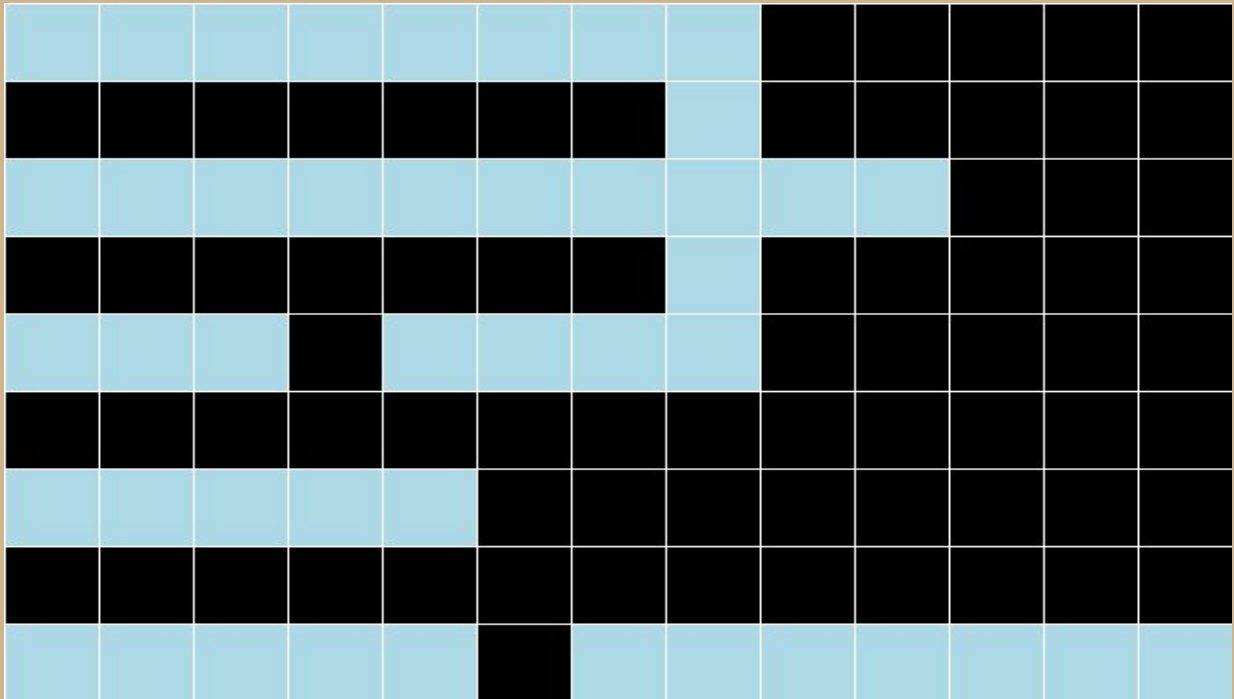
Joy and sorrow — so often side by side. Like sipping sweetness laced with pain and grief, we live in the in-between.

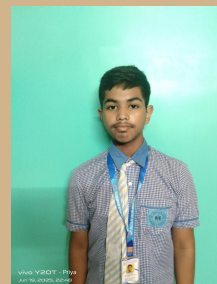

Kings and pawns in thoughtful flow, From Vishy's light, our legends grow.

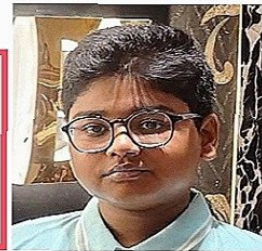

WORLD BLOOD DONOR DAY 2025

Intro: World Blood Donor Day is celebrated every year by people around the world on June 14. It is celebrated on the birthday anniversary of Karl Landsteiner on June 14, 1868. Landsteiner was awarded the Nobel Prize for his discovery of the ABO blood group system. Blood donation is a life-saving act of giving, where healthy individuals voluntarily donate a portion of their blood to be used for transfusions and other medical treatments. This donated blood helps individuals recover from injuries, surgeries, or illnesses, providing crucial support during emergencies and ongoing health challenges.

Every year 14th of June we celebrate the World Blood Donor Day. On this day specifically we honor millions of people who donate blood to another millions of people and saved their lives. On this day it also consists of a person's birthday a Nobel-prize winning scientist, Karl Landsteiner, who discovered the blood groups of ABO.

This was first established by World Health Organization (WHO) on 2004 in collaboration with the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, the International Federation of Blood Donor Organisations, and the International Society of Blood Transfusion.

WBBD 2025 (June 14)

Health Minister Prakash Abitkar announced a state-level drive to streamline blood collection and distribution, especially tackling seasonal shortages and waste. They're also considering NAT testing for improved safety, and introducing stricter NOC regulations for blood banks. Over 150 registered donors yielding 74

units at RSM Joint Hospital. Officials donated too and planted saplings. Around 15 units added at other events.

As students and future leaders, it is our responsibility to build a society that values life and compassion. By donating blood, we don't just give a few minutes of our time—we give someone another chance to live, to laugh, and to love.

Let us remember: *"You don't have to be a doctor to save lives—just be a blood donor."*

In a world often divided by differences, blood donation is a beautiful reminder that we are all connected. Our blood carries not just oxygen—it carries hope, unity, and humanity.

May the spirit of giving stay alive in all of us—not just on June 14, but every single day.

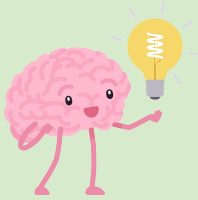
